He attended Harvard University, graduating cum laude with a degree in English Literature, and later completed his graduate studies at the New England Conservatory of Music. He has performed as soloist with the San Francisco Symphony, Los Angeles Philharmonic, New World Symphony, Boston Pops, Los Angeles and National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland amongst others.
