Standing, as able, all join in praying the canticle

The Readings

First Reading (*seated*)

1 John 3:16-24

Reader A reading from the First Letter of John

¹⁶ This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ died for us. And we, too, ought to lay down our lives for our sisters and brothers. ¹⁷ If you have more than enough material possessions and see your neighbors in need yet close your hearts to them, how can the love of God be living in you? ¹⁸

My children, our love must not be simply words or mere talk—it must be true love, which shows itself in action and truth. ¹⁹ This, then, is how we'll know we belong to the truth; this is how we'll be confident in God's presence, ²⁰ even if our consciences condemn us. We know that God is greater than our consciences and that God knows everything. ²¹ And if our consciences do not condemn us, my friends, then we have confidence before God, ²² and we will receive whatever we ask from God's hand—because we keep the commandments and do what is pleasing in God's sight.

²³ The commandments are these: that we believe in the name of God's Own, Jesus Christ, and that we love one another as we were told to do. ²⁴ Those who keep these commandments live in God and God lives in them. We know that God lives in us by the Spirit given to us.

Reader ¹ O God, you are my shepherd—

I want nothing more.

All ² **You let me lie down in green meadows;**

you lead me beside restful waters:

for the sake of your Name.

All ⁴ **Even if I'm surrounded by shadows of Death,**

I fear no danger, for you are with me.

Your rod and your staff—they give me courage.

Reader ⁵ You spread a table for me in the presence of my enemies,
and you anoint my head with oil—my cup overflows!

All ⁶ **Only goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life,

John 10:11-18

Reader The ✠ Holy Gospel of our ✠ Savior Jesus Christ ✠ according to John.

All **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

¹¹ Jesus said, I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd would die for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand, who is neither shepherd nor owner of the sheep, catches sight of the wolf coming and runs away, leaving the sheep to be scattered or snatched by the wolf. ¹³ That's because the hired hand works only for pay and has no concern for the sheep.

¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me, ¹⁵ in the same way Creator God knows me and I know God—and for these sheep I will lay down my life.

¹⁶ I have other sheep that don't belong to this fold—I must lead them too, and they will hear my voice. And then there will be one flock, one shepherd.

17 This is why Creator God loves me—because I lay down my life, only to take it up again. 18 No one takes my life from me; I lay it down freely. I have the power to lay it down, and I have the power to take it up again. This command I received from God my Source and Creator.”

Presenting and dedicating our gifts (*standing, as able*)

Leader Asking: 'Why do you stand looking up into heaven?'
Jesus comes to us again and again;
All **in all people, in the bread and wine of this table
and in the communion of peace.**

The Great Thanksgiving (*standing, as able*)

Leader God is here.
All **God's Spirit is with us.**
Leader Lift up your hearts.
All **We lift them to the Lord.**
Leader Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
All **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

(*seated or standing*)

Leader We praise you, God of freedom, for you breathed life into the void and showed yourself as the one who loves in freedom.

From the nothingness of slavery you called a people into being and led them to springs of life; the presence of your glory went with shattered exiles into strange and distant lands and gathered from the valley of despair the flesh and blood of living hope.

In Jesus, you confronted the powers that killed and oppressed. You spoke to those considered dead and helped them stand again; you taught us to die that we might live.

You gave yourself for us tortured and forsaken, but you could not be confined by death; in the garden you speak our name, in the breaking of the bread you show yourself among us; by the lakeside, in the new day, you call us to take up your work.

Therefore, with all who lost faith, all who walked away in sadness, with the women at the tomb, and the men who hid in fear, we confess ourselves surprised by the suddenness of dawn and join the undying song of heaven:

THE 10 AM SERVICE

All **Holy, holy, holy: God of mercy, giver of life; earth, sea, sky, and all that lives, declare your presence and your glory. Hosanna in the highest.**

Leader We ask that your Holy Spirit will ✠ fall upon us and upon these gifts that these fragile, earthly things may be to us the body and blood of our savior, Jesus Christ; who, on the night that he was betrayed, gathered with his faltering friends for a meal that tasted of freedom.

Calling them to his table, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said: "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me."

In the same way after supper, he took the cup, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, to remember me." As on that night, so here and now he offers himself in touch and taste beyond all words can hold.

Great is the mystery of faith.

All **Christ dies with us. Christ rises in us. Christ comes to us again and again.**

Therefore, we come to him in whom all is created in heaven and on earth, whose cross and resurrection make all things new.

We offer this to you, asking you to smile upon the gifts we bring, for you alone are the Giver and Christ's the gift through which we live once and for all.

Through the One who was emptied to bear your fullness we make our prayer with all created life to the glory of the God who fills all in all now and for ever.

All **AMEN.**

(seated or standing)

Leader And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

All **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Breaking of the Bread *(A period of silence is kept.)*

Leader We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ.

All **We who are many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.**

The Invitation *(standing, as able)*

Leader The Gifts of God for the People of God.

The Communion *(seated / standing, as able)*

The ministers of communion will come to you. As you wish, remain seated until they do. Please stand, as able, to receive. Please receive the host in your hands and take the small cup from the tray to receive. It is customary to respond "Amen" to the words of administration. An acolyte will pick up your cup in a basket.

Minister The Body of Christ, the Bread of heaven.

Response Amen.

Minister The Blood of Christ, the Cup of Salvation.

Response Amen.
